Party Pennants

GET THE PARTY STARTED WITH A STRING OF FESTIVE FLAGS.

From county fairs to Christmas tree lots, pennants have always been a clear indication that a good time is about to be had by all. But you don't need a national holiday—or any reason at all, for that matter—to create a celebratory mood. All you need is some string and a few fun scraps of wallpaper.

Materials

CARDSTOCK FOR TEMPLATE

WALLPAPER SCRAPS

(EACH AT LEAST 6" × 13")

STRING

Tools

PHOTOCOPIER

PENCIL

X-ACTO KNIFE

BONE FOLDER

METAL RULER

RUBBER CEMENT

How-To

1. Enlarge the diamond template 200 percent, so that it measures approximately 12" × 6" top to bottom.
2. Trace the pattern on a piece of cardstock, cut it out with an X-Acto knife, and use this as a template for the pennants.
3. Trace the template onto your wallpaper scraps of choice, and cut out your pennants.
4. Score a horizontal line across the middle of each paper with a bone folder and metal ruler as your guide, and fold it in half toward the back side.
5. Hang a pennant by folding it over the string and securing the front and back edges with rubber cement. Make sure you carefully line up all the edges.
6. Measure 3" down the string and attach the next pennant.
